

Look Back to Look Forward

As I round the corner to one year with BAGA, I've been reflecting on recent failures and accomplishments. I read once, that looking back makes the view looking forward so much clearer, but that you need to do it like using your car's rear view mirror – look back to see how far you've come but don't lose sight of what's ahead.

These past several months have been hard. I didn't know what to do, or how to do it, at first. And I didn't really know if I should, or could, do some things. We got through many events, although with a few hiccups; Many people learned I work at BAGA but had no idea BAGA produced the Capital A'Fair; I hung artwork in the gallery for the first time and found I hung it too high; I noticed how awkward it is to sell items at the front desk with the credit card machine in a different room and with no shelf for people to sign receipts; I heard comments about our stained carpeting and heard numerous people ask where the restrooms are; I also found it really difficult to pay online for classes, memberships, events or exhibit registrations because we only have a button on our website called "donate now" for checkout.

Looking back at these things has helped us determine what to focus on going forward.

BAGA will have more of a presence at the Capital A'Fair including a booth; I've researched how to properly hang artwork and have made adjustments to my process (which includes a tape measure); we have added a new credit card machine at the front counter and we will be adding a shelf; Because of many generous donations from members, the public and businesses, we raised enough money to replace our worn-out flooring and we will be adding signs for the restrooms; We are tackling additional upkeep, such as repainting our cubes and making repairs to our brick wall; and we are redesigning our website so you can become a member, renew your membership, make donations, purchase event tickets or fill out exhibit forms online. Watch for the new website in early summer!

Looking back and learning is what enables us to move forward, while staying focused on our dreams. BAGA has been a staple in this community for 40 years. Our dream is that BAGA continues to be a place where artists show and sell their work, the public embraces new art and ideas, and we grow as a gallery to ensure we sustain our presence long into the future.

Stick with us. There are many good things to come.

Johnathan Campbell Featured Artist

As a child, Bismarck native Johnathan Campbell's dream was to assemble dinosaur skeletons. Years later, that is exactly what he got to do. To realize this childhood dream, Johnathan pursued a geology major at UND.

The required math courses were the reason he changed his major to art where he took a lot of photography classes. He realized that assembling fossils was as

much about art as it was about science.

After graduating in 1995, he got a job with the State Geological Society where he was the fossil preparator at the ND Heritage Center. This involved gathering fossils in the field, cleaning and cataloging them and assembling them for display for the public. With assistance, he assembled a 25-foot-long marine lizard that is now on display at the center. The bones are attached to a steel frame and sometimes missing pieces must be sculpted by hand. There are no blueprints to the exact assembly of these specimens so it is like a giant puzzle.

After working there for 11 years, he is now the site supervisor for

the Former Governors' Mansion and Camp Hancock State Historic Sites where he runs the day-today operations of both facilities.

Around 2014, he realized he missed photography, so he bought a digital camera and

began what is now more than a hobby. He devotes spare time to what he calls painting with light. "Most people can't understand what I do until they see it in action. With the

digital camera shutter open for 2-3 minutes, I draw with a light using handheld electroluminous wire. The wire comes in a limited pallet of colors. I memorize where each colored wire is located so I can find what I want in the dark. I even dress all in black clothes

so I don't show up in the image. Any light source would work for this and you can even use a cell phone light." he states.

He then uploads the images to a web

site that prints them on canvas.
He also uses film cameras and does his own dark room work.
He is in the process of setting up a complete darkroom in his new



home. "I posted on Facebook for used equipment and got a lot of things for free. I now have 3 enlargers," he jokes.

In 2021, Jonathan's work, titled "Me, Myself and the Darkness", was chosen by the ND Art Galleries Association to be featured at three art galleries across the state. He was also the artist in residence at Beaver Lake State Park in 2017 and Cross Ranch State Park in 2021 where he gave presentations and encouraged viewers to participate. "At Cross Ranch the nighttime temperatures dropped to minus 25 degrees and my plastic light brushes shattered. You can imagine trying to do art when you are bundled up against the cold. I also do what are called star trails, where the camera on a tripod takes 20 second images 300-400

> times. I then stack the images on the computer to produce the startrails as well as time lapse video of the stars in the night sky," says Johnathan.

His art has been featured in the member gallery at BAGA and he had a solo exhibit at the BDAC gallery in 2021. He also works in stained glass and copper.






Volunteers Needed!

Call For Submissions

Bismarck Art & Galleries Association will be curating an exhibition in December 2023 "The Artistry of Trees." This call for submissions is for original poetry with trees as the focus. Poems submitted should be no longer than 250 words in length. Any form of poetry is acceptable and a maximum of three (3) poems may be made in each submission. Poets must grant BAGA the right to display their poems in the exhibition and use them for any type of publicity and marketing related to the exhibition. Poetry may be previously published work as long as the poet acknowledges where the poem was published and he/ she has retained the rights to the poem.

many Native Americans, the earth and everything a part of it are linked and possess a supernatural presence, but some places or elements of nature are considered especially significant. Produced by North Dakota Council on the Arts under the direction of State Folklorist Troyd Geist, in association with the State Historical Society of North Dakota,

On the Edge of the Wind: Native Storytellers & the Land explores the connections between cultural practices, regional landscapes, and tribal oral narratives. Based on interviews with Native storytellers and knowledge keepers, this exhibition, which will be located in the Governor's Gallery at the North Dakota Heritage Center and State Museum, includes photographs, artifacts, and video recordings of elders recounting traditional stories.




