
board members and volunteers whose active participation and support make BAGA a vibrant and thriving art community (huge capacity).

BAGA members, Lisa and Clare Carlson are champion supporters of the organization and the work of local artists. "I counted over 120 pieces of art in our home and that's not even counting the pottery or wooden pieces. Most pieces were purchased at BAGA but a few came from NDSU fundraisers," Clare states.

"During our home remodeling process everything was stored in the garage and the artwork had to "earn" its way to a permanent place in our home," Lisa says. Portraits of former and current pets fill one hallway wall. The chicken wall of the kitchen features hens and roosters and a few other barnyard creatures. A bedroom corner wall is dedicated to cat portraits and an area in the basement is reserved for western art with cowboys,

horses and livestock. Lisa's love of flowers shows in the many florals through out the home with many of them coming from the annual Square Foot show at BAGA. "I think that show is so fun in that all the pieces are the same size and shape but the works show a wide variety of subject matter and styles," says Lisa.

Also prominently displayed, are several pieces from Mandan artist, Frosty Paris. "We thought that was appropriate to display his work since we bought the home from his

Clare has been a member of the BAGA board since 2008. He has been the emcee for many gallery events and assists with the set-up for Capital A'Fair and other fund raisers. Each year, Clare and Lisa donate a dinner at their home to raise funds for the

Southern BBQ. They also contribute financially by being Rembrandt members. When asked why he donates his time and talents to the gallery he says it is something so different from the rest of his life. Lisa says, "BAGA is art for the masses in that a person can purchase art that doesn't cost thousands. We also think it is important to support local artists," says Lisa.

Clare is from Crookston, MN and graduated from NDSU with a degree in agricultural economics. He has worked in a variety of jobs, mostly in agriculture and government. Lisa hails from Valley City and attended VCSU and also Moorhead State University. She moved from teaching music to working for over 30 years as a mortgage lender in Moorhead, MN, Fargo, Grand Forks and Bismarck, ending her career at the Bank of North Dakota. In his spare time, Clare raises and preserves vegetables from his large garden and Lisa raises flowers. She states that this is her form of creating art. Their commitment to the success of BAGA benefits all local artists.

To Be Hung Over Art Sale

Resell and Purchase New Artwork!

BAGA will host the 12th Annual *To Be Hung Over Art Sale* 2024. This sale is a unique opportunity for those with art to remarket those pieces. If you have art on your wall or in your closet that no longer suits you or was bought on a whim, this is an opportunity for you to sell those pieces. To participate in this sale you must register your pieces with BAGA by March 22, 2024. Drop off day for art is Friday, March 29 from 10 am-5 pm. Unsold pieces must be picked up April 6, 2024 from 10 am-1 pm.

To be eligible for the *To Be Hung Over Art Sale*, art must be in good condition, clean and without chips, cracks or breaks. It can be paintings, prints, drawings, pottery, ceramics, sculpture, photography or fiber arts. Paintings and wall hangings MUST be wired for hanging, no saw tooth hangers will be accepted. Known collectibles will also be accepted for this sale. Examples include Lladro, Anri, Frakoma, Hummel, Wedgewood, Goebel, Limoges, Tiffany, etc. The gallery reserves the right not to accept any piece for the sale. This is NOT a sale for artists to sell their work, but for consumers to resell past purchases.

When pricing your art, keep in mind it may not be worth what you originally paid for it. If you wish it to sell, price it accordingly. Art owners are limited to 2-4 artworks.

BAGA will retain a 30% commission on all sales. All sales are cash and carry. For more information on the *To Be Hung Over Art Sale* contact Lynae or Jan at 223-5986.

Safety First

Have you ever had a moment where it's just a little too dark as you're walking to your car and you worry where your next step will land?
